



## **Open Science in Horizon Europe: Publications**

The <u>Horizon Europe Open Science Policy</u> states that beneficiaries must provide **online open access (OA)** to reusable research data, results and publications that is **free of charge to the user**.

For **publications**, there are two routes to open access:

**Gold** The final version of an article is freely and permanently accessible to everyone immediately upon publication Green ("self-archiving")

Placing a final version of an article in an online repository at the point of publication making it freely accessible.

## How to comply with Horizon Europe open access publishing requirements:

- Publish in an OA venue AND deposit a machine-readable electronic copy of the published version (VOR), or the final peer-reviewed manuscript accepted for publication (AAM) in a trusted repository\* at the same time as first publication. Only publishing in an OA venue without depositing in a repository will not comply with the Horizon Europe OA requirement.
- You may publish in a subscription-based or hybrid journal, as long as a VOR or AAM version of the manuscript is deposited in a repository and made freely accessible at the point of publication.
- Ensure OA is available via the repository under the latest available version of the Creative Commons Attribution International Public Licence (CC BY) or a licence with equivalent rights. For monographs and other long-text formats, the licence may exclude commercial uses and derivative works (e.g. CC BY-NC, CC BY-ND or CC BY-NC-ND or equivalent licences).
- Information must be given via the repository about any research output or any other tools and instruments needed to validate the conclusions of your scientific publication.
- Check whether the call conditions impose any additional obligations regarding open science practices as beneficiaries must also comply with these.

## **Publication Fees:**

- Publishing costs incurred for publications in fully open access venues are eligible costs and can be charged to the Horizon Europe grant. (Include these figures in budget at costing stage).
- Publishing costs for publications in subscription (including hybrid) journals or in books that contain some scholarly content that is open and some that is closed are **not eligible costs.**
- Publishing fees for OA books may be eligible to the extent that they cover the first digital OA edition of the book (which could include different formats such as html, pdf, epub, etc.). Printing fees for monographs and other books are not eligible.
